SNAPSHOTS OF CONEY ISLAND

AfterHours program at the Transit Museum on Tuesday, October 4

For nearly 100 years, Coney Island has been one of Brooklyn's most iconic destinations. For creative photographers interested in documenting New York City's people, landscape, and attractions, Coney Island has provide a rich subject for nearly as long. On Tuesday, October 4th, at 6:30pm, join photographer **Elaine Norman, Larry Racioppo, Doug Ross, and Norman Borden** in conversation with the Transit Museum's Associate Curator **Jodi Shapiro** for a discussion on Coney Island's transformation as seen through their cameras' lenses.

Featured panelists include:

Elaine Norman is an artist, illustrator, and designer who lives and works in New York City. She studied Fine Art at the Pratt Institute and pursued additional coursework at the School of Visual Arts and the International Center of Photography. Her work has been exhibited in museums and galleries nationwide, including the New York Transit Museum, the Museum of the City of New York, and the Brooklyn Public Library. Larry Racioppo is a New York City photographer whose work focuses on the urban landscape. In 1989, he became the Staff Photographer for New York City's Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD), and in 1997, he received a John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Fellowship for his series of large panoramic urban landscapes. He retired from HPD in 2011 and continues photographing throughout New York City, returning often to South Brooklyn and Coney Island. Learn more at <http://larryracioppo.com/>.

Doug Ross is an accomplished commercial photographer with over twenty years of professional experience providing imagery for the cosmetic, luxury retail, food and corporate industries. His personal Coney Island photography projects are dedicated in memory of his father and have been exhibited in museums and galleries throughout New York City, including the New York Transit Museum, the SoHo Gallery for Digital Art, Coney Island USA Shooting Gallery/Arts Annex, and a digital presentation at the Museum of Modern Art. Norman Borden is a native New Yorkers, and mostly self-taught photographer, who is old enough to remember seeing the Parachute Jump in operation. He is a member artist of the Soho

Photo Gallery, and his work has been in juried group shows at the New Orleans Photo Alliance, the Darkroom Gallery in Vermont, and the Griffin Museum of Photography in Winchester, MA. Jodi Shapiro, Associate Curator at the New York Transit Museum, will moderate the discussion. She is the co-curator of the Transit Museum’s exhibition, *Five Cents to Dreamland: A Trip to Coney Island*. Prior to joining the Transit Museum, Jodi worked as a journalist, an educator, and an archivist for several artists’ estates, including a number of world-renowned photographers.
