

When it's time for Movers and Makers to start, I will go with my adult to the Education Center. The doors may be closed. I can wait until an Educator says it's okay to go inside.




The Museum Educators will welcome me and my adult to the program. They will ask for my name and my adult's name, and then they will give us nametags.

Other families may join us. When everyone is checked in, the Museum Educators will go over the schedule for the program, so we know what to expect.

Next, the Educators will lead us on a tour out in the Museum. It's important to stay with the group and follow the museum's rules so we can be safe. We may see old train cars on the platform, and we may see some of the exhibits on the mezzanine like *Steel, Stone, and Backbone*. If I have any questions, I can ask the Museum Educators.



There may be a lot of visitors in the Museum, and it can be loud. It's okay if I need to take a break in a quieter space with my adult. If I want to, I can bring my own noise quieting headphones or borrow a pair from the museum.





After the tour, we will go back to the Education Center to work on a project or an art making activity inspired by an object or artifact we saw in the Museum or a something we talked about on the tour. My adult and I can work together, or we can work on our own.



When the workshop is over, we will say goodbye to the Museum Educators and then my family or my adult and I can explore the Museum together on our own.
